Videos and other information

During the Spring of 2021, because of Covid-19, I gave the course as an online course based on videos and my plan is to use the fact that I now have these videos. Hence unless we decide otherwise at the first lecture, I plan to use videos together with physical classes for the lectures. This will mean that some (but far from all!) physical lectures may be cancelled. NB: It is very important to note that, just as it is the case with physical lectures, the videos will often not cover all the material in the relevant sections of the book. Thus you must read all of the listed material in order to get a full understanding.

You are expected to read Sipser Chapter 0 yourself. We will not cover anything from that (explicitly) during the lectures.
