1. Try doing an sftp command on a Linux or Mac computer. You can login to an IMADA computer using the command

sftp yourlogin@login.imada.sdu.dk

using your own login name for yourlogin. Before doing this, use the man command to find out how to use it. The most relevant commands are get, put, cd, and quit. Try copying files back and forth.

- 2. Try doing an **ssh** command to login (again on a Linux or Mac computer, or try using PuTTY for Windows) to the same machine as with **sftp**. You can check if the file you put there is actually there.
- 3. Discuss question 28 on page 212 of the textbook.
- 4. Try creating an HTML page with at least one link. View it using your browser. (Note that in Chrome, for example, in the File menu, there is an option Open File... option which will allow you to see an HTML file you have created.) What happens when you try changing the title in your HTML code? What is the difference between h1 and h2?
- 5. View some HTML page on the Internet. Look at the page source (HTML code) for the page. This can be generally be done by saving the page you are looking at in your own directory and then looking at it using an editor.
- 6. Discuss your experiences with the above experiments, and show each other your HTML code.
